Provides monthly grants to families suffering hardship due to their child’s cancer diagnosis. Must fill out application on website. \$500 Takes a month or so to process: Need SW referral. Sent directly to families. No 3rd party payments.

Provides financial assistance, social support, and information for families of children with brain and spinal cord tumors; funds research projects that improve treatment options and search for a cure; and raise public awareness of the disease and advocate on behalf of children who are affected. Also have several scholarships they award. Through their Butterfly Fund financial assistance will help with funds for rent, mortgage, utilities, car loans, insurance and repairs up to \$2,000 available for lifetime. Families being treated at All Children’s and St. Joseph’s Children’s Hospital are eligible and must be made through the Social Worker.
