OUR JOURNEY

1974: A legacy of love

After losing their daughter, Helen, to leukemia, Mac and Cecile Burnett joined forces with Dr. Janifer Judisch, one of only three pediatric hematology/oncology physicians in Florida at the time, to create an organization dedicated to easing the stress families face when a child is diagnosed with a life-threatening illness. Dr. Judisch believed in the art of medicine: caring not just for the disease, but for the needs it creates for the whole family.

Finding A New Home

When Moffitt Cancer Center opened, Children's Cancer Center moved from USF, where Dr. Judisch practiced, to Moffitt's pediatric ward, expanding our reach to more families in need.

Growing Beyond Boundaries

After Moffitt's pediatric cancer program closed, the CCC Board of Directors voted to become a freestanding organization dedicated to serving all children and families diagnosed with pediatric cancer in partnership with Johns Hopkins All Children's, St. Joseph's Children's Hospital, and Muma Children's Hospital at Tampa General Hospital.

Today: A Place of Healing & Hope

Our stand-alone facility on Cypress Street is home to 30 programs, offering therapeutic programs and essential support. Over the past 50 years, our mission has continued to soar, embracing new families, innovative programs, and the enduring vision of Dr. Judisch: caring for not only the child diagnosed, but the whole family.

Her artwork will appear on holiday cards this year, and she continues to raise awareness through media appearances. 

CARING FOR THE Mind & Heart

At the Children's Cancer Center, we know the impact of childhood cancer extends far beyond the hospital. Families often carry the weight of trauma, fear, and uncertainty long after treatment ends. Through our partnership with licensed mental health counselors at Sheltering Oaks Counseling and Forty Carrots Family Center, we provide families with access to counseling services that help them process the emotional toll of their journey.

Gabby, mom of four-year-old brain cancer survivor Emersyn, shared: "When your child receives a cancer diagnosis, there is quite literally one focus on your mind, on your heart, at all times. Survival... We made it out of survival mode; through our tunnel vision. On the other side of months and months of trauma... you're left with a completely transformed way of living—how do you heal that?... You obviously ask CCC for help! Because they are constant. A constant source of peace, of community, and of resources... Therapy resources were the most healing thing that CCC brought us. Working through our trauma in play therapy and individual therapy was an incredible gift that CCC gave to us. Our home, our family, is better for that gift."

Thanks to the generosity of our community, these vital services are provided at no cost, ensuring every family has the opportunity to heal emotionally as they navigate life after childhood cancer.

FINDING HEALING THROUGH Art Therapy

At 12 years old, Hannah, a Medulloblastoma survivor, has found healing and joy through Art Therapy with Kendal Neal, LMHC, ATR. For Hannah, these sessions are more than creative expression; they're a safe space where she can share her feelings freely.

"I love art therapy because I can talk about anything I want and what I am feeling, and it's not another doctor's appointment. Kendal listens to me and lets me talk without trying to fix all my problems. My favorite thing I've created is a wolf drawing — I loved drawing wolves before cancer, and now I have a space to do that again." – Hannah

Despite the three-hour round trip, Hannah never hesitates to go. When her parents can't make the drive, her siblings, Claire and Joe, step in, turning the trips into bonding time filled with conversation and shared meals. What began as a program for Hannah has grown into meaningful moments for the whole family.

HOSPITAL OUTREACH:

CARE BEYOND Our Doors

LOVE BUNDLES

Our Program and Family Services team delivers custom care packages filled with comfort items, books, and games weekly to newly diagnosed children in the hospital. These bundles are meant to offer comfort and emotional reassurance to children at the start of their treatment process. This year, we were honored to provide Love Bundles to 131 newly diagnosed oncology patients referred to our organization. Serving as the first touchpoint with families, these love bundles are a warm introduction to the essential therapies and support groups that we offer.



MONTHLY INPATIENT MEALS

Our monthly inpatient meal program provides catered dinners for patients and families on the Oncology Floor at Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital, giving them a chance to step away from their rooms and share a moment of comfort together. This year, we provided meals to **86 family members** through this program, helping to ease the hospital experience and build community for families facing treatment.

SOCIAL WORK APPRECIATION BREAKFAST

Twice per year, child life specialists and social workers specializing in pediatric oncology and hematology are invited to participate in breakfast and program collaboration at the Children's Cancer Center. These hospital partnerships are an integral source of communication and vital in allowing us to meet the current and evolving needs of the families and support the hospital healthcare teams.

NUTRITIONAL SUPPORT

Through our partnership with ReBuilt Meals, we provide families with nutritious, ready-to-enjoy meals that support clean eating and a healthy diet throughout their journey. In the past year, we delivered 408 healthy meals to 81 families, ensuring they had convenient, nourishing options waiting for them after long days at the hospital. This meal program is part of our Restoring Inner Strength & Energy (RISE) initiative, which promotes active living and attainable nutrition for families at every stage through movement sessions, nutrition education, and healthy meal deliveries - another example of our conciergestyle support designed to ease daily burdens while prioritizing wellness for both children and their families.

EVENTS:

OUR COMMUNITY Makes A Difference

The Children's Cancer Center had another impactful year of fundraising events, where our incredible community came together to support the children and families we serve. Through our signature events, we raised \$1,181,435 and touched the lives of 5,000 children and their family members, making a significant difference in their journey. Every contribution, whether big or small, played a vital role in helping us reach our goals and provide essential support. We are deeply grateful to our donors, sponsors, volunteers, and attendees for their generosity and unwavering commitment. Thank you for standing beside us and making this work possible.



This year's Palm Royale-themed event delivered timeless glamour and old Florida charm complete with lush greenery, live swing music and a fashion show featuring

vintage-inspired resort wear. Guests enjoyed 680 bottles of wine, 500 pairs of shoes were worn in style, and 91 'Sole Men' were at your service. Together, more than 5,000 CCC children and families were served through the support generated, with \$301,284 raised in sponsorships and \$482,275 raised through the Bid from the Heart. Despite a date change, the evening delivered an extraordinary impact, resulting in \$923,933 in net proceeds.

EMBRACING Our Future

Expanding Our Reach:

Due to the lack of pediatric cancer treatment options in Sarasota, families are forced to travel long distances for care, underscoring the need for accessible local services. In 2019, we opened our first satellite location in Sarasota, making it easier for over **500 children** and their families to access our programs while fostering a supportive community where families can connect with others facing similar challenges. Today, the Children's Cancer Center is proud to bring the full breadth of our programs and support services to Sarasota, ensuring families have access to the same compassionate care and resources closer to home.

Looking Forward: 2030 PLAN

We are proud to announce the expansion of our model of care to Wesley Chapel and Lakeland, bringing essential services closer to the families who need them most. The success of our Sarasota satellite location has demonstrated the demand and impact of concierge oncology support, and our 2030 Strategic Plan builds on this proven model. Guided by our three pillars - Rise, Reach, and Retreat - we aim to Rise by scaling CCC's impact across nine counties, Reach by expanding partnerships with hospitals, and Retreat by establishing the RISE Retreat Center. By extending these services to Wesley Chapel and Lakeland, we are ensuring more families have access to the same compassionate, personalized care that has become the beacon of the Children's Cancer Center.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:

2024-2025 Highlights & Wins

50TH ANNIVERSARY Celebration:

52 families gathered under gold kites and a bright blue sky to celebrate our 50th Anniversary, uniting children in treatment, survivors, and their loved ones. We were especially honored to have our founder, Dr. Jan Judisch, now 94, join us and reunite with families she once guided through their most difficult times - including her very first patient. The day marked five decades of care and underscored our enduring mission: that kids should fly kites, not fight cancer, and that the Children's Cancer Center will always stand beside families through every stage of their journey.

RECORD-SETTING Holiday Adoption:

This year, our Holiday Adoption program reached new heights, serving a record **180 families**, including **514 children and teens**. Through the generosity of community donors, families with a child on active treatment for cancer or a chronic blood disorder received holiday gifts, easing the weight of financial and time pressures during the season. Winters & Yonker, P.A. donated \$52,000 in in-kind gifts, adopting 20 families and continuing their tradition of being our largest supporter since 2017. We are also deeply grateful to the Pagliarulo Family Foundation, whose unwavering support for over two decades has been a cornerstone of this program. For many, these gifts provided a sense of normalcy and the joy of the holidays, even for patients who had to celebrate in their hospital rooms.
